



High School Program: CU Succeed Platinum

Campus Wide Extended Studies

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Information for Students & Parents

CU Succeed Platinum is a unique partnership between the University of Colorado Colorado Springs (UCCS) and select high schools. The program provides current high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit while concurrently fulfilling their high school requirements.

CU Succeed Platinum courses are taught in the high school by UCCS faculty.

CU Succeed Platinum courses are regular university courses that appear in the University catalogue, not high school courses for which students receive university credit.

CU Succeed Platinum courses appear on an official UCCS transcript as do other courses of the University. Policies regarding the transfer of credits and the specific ways in which they apply to degree requirements vary from institution to institution.



Benefits of the CU Succeed Platinum Program

Accessibility and Convenience

Courses are offered at your high school in the afternoon/evening.

Low Tuition

Tuition for CU Succeed Platinum courses is substantially lower than that charged for the same course on the UCCS campus.

Dual High School and College Credit

You can earn college credits at the same time you satisfy high school requirements, saving time and money in completing a college degree. CU Succeed Platinum courses are college credit and each high school may or may not also provide high school credit.



Tuition for the CU Succeed Platinum Program

The tuition for CU Succeed courses is \$75 and must be paid via the UCCS portal. This cost is substantially less than if the course was taken on the UCCS campus. **Payment is due by the first day of class; however, payments will begin to be accepted beginning August 9th, 2015.** Late payments may be subject to late fees.



Grading Policies for the CU Succeed Platinum Program

Grades earned in CU Succeed Platinum courses become a part of a student's University of Colorado academic record. Therefore, it is extremely important that a student earn at least a 'C' grade in CU Succeed courses. A grade of C-minus or below could prevent a student from being admitted to any campus in the University of Colorado system, regardless of the student's high school GPA or college entrance exam scores. A C- corresponds to a GPA of 1.70, and students must have a minimum of a 2.0 University GPA to be admitted to or remain in good standing at the University.
