<p>District Committee Updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• District Accountability Committee (DAC)-Elisa</li> <li>• Parent Sounding Board-Christina</li> </ul>	<p>DAC: There was a board election on Tuesday night, at this point the two candidates that are confirmed are Karin Reynolds and Tom LaValley. The 3<sup>rd</sup> candidate was so close that a mandatory recount is taking place. The DAC is getting ready to do accreditation reviews on 11/14/17. Elisa also talked about the PPR (Per Pupil Revenue) and The Village costs more per student than our traditional schools (\$7,000 vs. \$9,500)</p> <p>PSB: The committee went on a tour of the district in a school bus to see all of the new building sites including Elementary 20/Center for Modern Learning, Chinook Trail Middle School, and the new elementary that will be built in the North Fork neighborhood. Christina also shared some highlights of upcoming commercial development in the district based on a report by Don Smith, who works with the district on planning and development.</p>

Priorities last year were facility update/upgrade, competency based curriculum and assessment program, staff development, and curriculum for supplemental courses. We spent \$98,703 of our \$99,040 allocation. ☺ AOHHS does not get any carryover so we take what is left at the end of each year and use it to purchase laptops for the following year.</p> <p>-Budget analysis by major category: Professional Services (LMS), Building Maintenance (modular remodel), Capital Equipment (laptops beyond replenishment), General Supplies, Instructional Supplies. The full budget expenditure by major category is attached.</p> <p>-Village/Access: Currently have 13 students in Access and 110 students in The Village. We expect to add a few students at semester and still have 5 9<sup>th</sup> grade slots available. See attached enrollment chart.</p> <p>-Electives: We have articulated the signature electives for each grade level. (See attached document) Our seniors will not have signature electives because we will schedule them individually based on the courses they still need to take, their college/career aspirations, etc. We are looking to pilot some Friday expeditionary learning intensives, similar to a college winter term. The framework for electives is attached.</p> <p>-Extended Studies Courses for 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester: Science Fiction 1, ACT/SAT Math Review, Global Health &amp; Wellness, Intro to PE, Civics &amp; Law, US History, College/Career Prep, Web Design</p> <p>-School performance framework: We have changed our state designation from K-12 to 9-12 which will give us different cut scores in the future. We got dinged on participation rates last year, but hope that with the change in testing to the SAT and PSAT, this will take care of itself.</p> <p>-CML renderings have been shared in the last weekly update e-mail to parents. The construction process is still on schedule to be completed next October. We will have to create a plan for transition and may wait until semester or have</p>

	<p>kids work from home for a week while we move. We are working with a furniture company (Meteor) to furnish the space.</p> <p>-We continue to wait on approval to occupy the new modular. Colorado Springs Utilities is still working to get power to the building. Unfortunately, we don't have an updated timeline.</p> <p>-We will be hosting a visit from Leadership Pikes Peak on 11/16/17. This is a group of community leaders that take on a different community issue each month and they have selected four schools to visit in the Pikes Peak region. We are one of the four and look forward to their visit.</p>
